



Fatal 4: Mobile Phones





the windscreen, windows and mirrors are clean all lights work the brakes work Your vehicle's handbook will tell you how often to check the:

engine oil water level in the radiator or expansion tank brake fluid level battery windscreen and rear window washer bottles - top up with windscreen washer fluid if necessary tyres - they must have the correct tread depth and be free of cuts and defects

The handbook will also tell you when your vehicle needs to be serviced.
